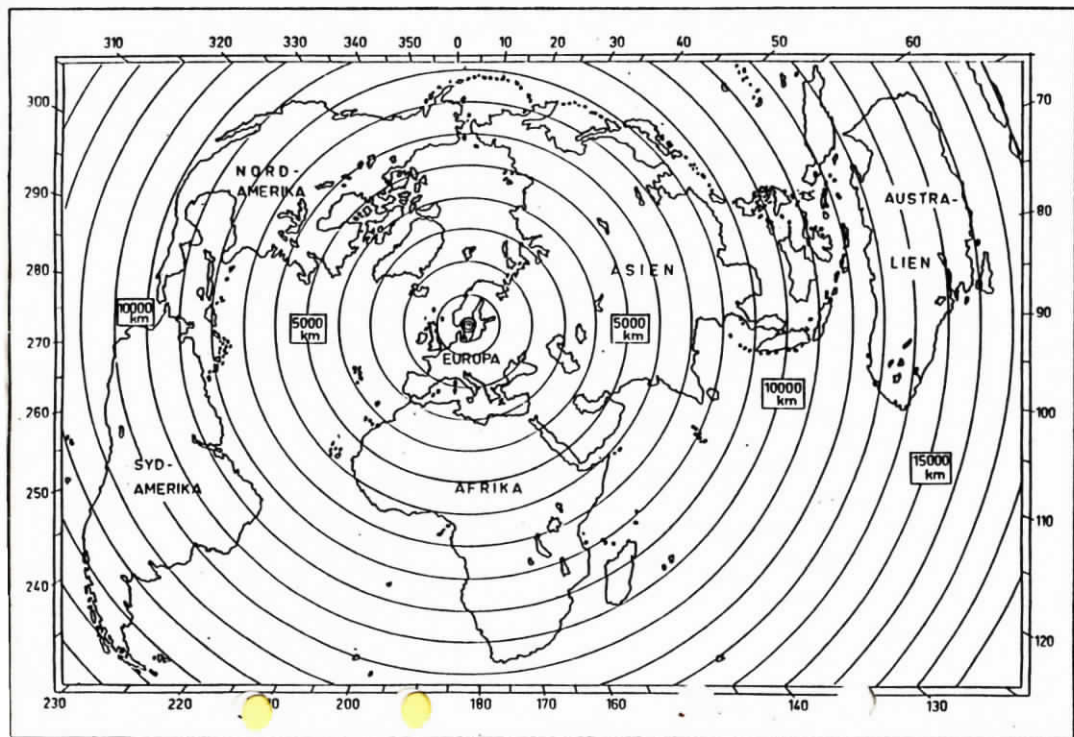

**SWEDEN**--One of the scheduled changes in the Radio Sweden International schedule after Mar. 3rd will not be made. The broadcasts to North America in English at 14:00 hrs, Swedish at 14:30, and French at 15:00 hrs are to remain on 15345 kHz. They will NOT change to 15190 kHz as previously mentioned in SCDX and printed in our new program schedule.

**SATELLITES**--After ten years of planning, the project to build a Nordic TV satellite has collapsed. According to Swedish Minister of Culture Bengt Göransson, he and his Norwegian, Finnish, and Icelandic colleagues are unable to reach agreement on the financing of the planned Tele-X satellite. Finland and Norway rejected Sweden's plan for channel rental. Tele-X would have carried two joint Nordic TV channels. (Dagens Nyheter)

**BOLIVIA**--Radio Stentor has returned to 6195 kHz, with the new name of Radio Nueva Stentor. (Latin American DX Report)

**BRAZIL**--Radio Itatiaia in Belo Horizonte has been heard on 6070 kHz, replacing 6080, at 01:40 hrs. This is in parallel with variable 4808 kHz. (Emilio Pedro Povrzenic, Argentina, in LADXR)

**CANADA**--Radio Canada International has been heard at 16:45 hrs on the unusual fq of 11325 kHz. (Patrick Oger, Alencon, France)

**FINLAND**--Radio Finland will change the fq of the morning transmission to the Middle East in English 05:30-05:55 hrs, beginning Mar. 3rd. 1945 kHz will replace 11735 kHz. Other changes will take place on April 1st. A morning service to Australia and the Far East will be introduced at 21:00 hrs. (Juhani Niinistö, Radio Finland)

**EAST GERMANY**--Deutsche Welle has made some changes in its transmissions to Australia and New Zealand. At 06:00-10:00 hrs in German, 6085 kHz replaces 11785 kHz. There are test transmissions in German 06:00-07:55 hrs on 7285 kHz, and in English 21:00-21:50 hrs on 6065 kHz. (Dan Turner, Australia)

**INDONESIA**--KTWR is having problems finding a clear fq to South Asia. Since Feb. 4th they've been using 9820 kHz 14:15-16:00 hrs. At 15:00 hrs 9525 kHz has replaced 9535, but will soon change to 9870 kHz. 9820 kHz has replaced 11920. (Victor Goonetilleke, Sri Lanka)

**NEPAL**--BISSAU--We reported in SCDX-1798 that Radiodifusao Nacional has been heard on 5475 kHz. Now heard 23:45 until sign-off at 24:00 hrs. (Martin Kelly, Illinois, USA)

**JAPAN**--Beginning Mar. 3rd. Radio Japan will use 11705 kHz instead of 11700 for the first European Service, 04:00-06:30 hrs. (Russian, Polish, Italian, German, and French.) 9570 and 9575 kHz are in parallel. (Mogens Jensen, Denmark and Michael Lindner, GDR)

**MEXICO**--XEOI, Radio Mil, has once again been heard on SW. Noted on 1000 kHz, in parallel with 1000 kHz (XEOY). Radio Mil is claiming to be Mexico's first and only station broadcasting in MW stereo, however no

**MW stereo receiving equipment is available in Mexico, making the claim difficult to prove. Since the end of January, XEQ, "La Q Mexicana", is using its old SW outlet of 9680 kHz. Now only 500 watts, relaying 940 kHz 12:00-06:00 hrs. XERNX, Radio Mexico Internacional, has dropped 17765 kHz, leaving only 9705 and 15430 kHz for the transmission 20:00-05:00 hrs. A new English newscast is said to have been introduced from February 1st and a 100 kW transmitter that has been around for 5 years without being used should finally become operational in mid-1985. (Christian Zettl, Mexico)**

**PHILIPPINES--Radio Veritas Asia is now using 9675 kHz instead of 9670 for English 15:00-15:30 hrs. (Gerald Arrington, California, USA) Beginning Mar. 3rd, FEBC will broadcast in Russian 14:00-18:00 and in German 18:00-19:00 hrs on 6080 kHz. The English broadcast to India 13:00-14:00 hrs will use 11920 kHz, continuing 14:00-16:00 hrs on 11905 kHz. English to South Asia 00:00-01:00 hrs will use 11915 kHz, continuing 01:00-05:00 hrs on 11815 kHz. 15445 kHz in is parallel to both. 05:00-10:00 hrs 21610 kHz will be used. (FEBC)**

**SAUDI ARABIA--The BSKSA has been heard in French at 16:30 hrs on 11685 kHz. (Michael Lindner)**

**SRI LANKA--The 2nd 300 kW transmitter from the new Deutsche Welle relay station is not yet on the air. What is being heard is a 10 kW communication link used to occupy the fq:s. Heard best with Bengali 01:00-01:50 and English 02:00-02:50 hrs on 15105 kHz (the 10 kW transmitter uses 17800 kHz in parallel). The 2nd 300 kW transmitter will go on the air in March. (Victor Goonetilleke) The agreement granting the Voice of America a 1000 acre site in the northwestern part of the island has been signed between the American Ambassador and the SLBC. About 200 families are being moved from their homes to make way for the new relay station. (UADX Newsletter) It will use one 500 kW and three 250 kW SW transmitters to carry programs in India's regional languages. (Lanka Guardian)**

**UGANDA--According to a letter from Radio Uganda Senior Transmitter Planning Engineer L.B. Lubega, the home service uses a 20 kW transmitter on 5027 kHz during the evening and night and on 7196 kHz during the day. The station is on the air 03:00-21:00 hrs, with English 04:00-04:15 hrs. The external service to North America is 03:00-04:15 hrs on 15325 kHz. (Neil Carleton, Ontario, Canada)**

**PUBLICATIONS--The long-awaited "Radio Database International Edition" will reportedly be available in late February. (UBIX)**

**COMPUTER CORNER**--The BBC World Service will be starting a new magazine program about computers and related topics, called "Computer World". The program begins on April 22nd and will be broadcast Mondays at 16:15 and 23:15 hrs and Tuesdays at 01:45 and 07:30 hrs. (Paul Kennett, England)

**ANGOLA**--Radio Nacional can be heard daily at 07:00 hrs in Portuguese on 11955 kHz. (Benedito Sérgio C. de Souza, Brazil). Radio Nacional has also been heard on 5334.4 kHz at 23:00 hrs.

**AUSTRALIA**--Radio Australia has been testing on 7240 kHz to South Asia. Heard 12:30-15:00 hrs in parallel with 6035, 6060, 6080, 7205, 9580, and 9710 kHz.

**BRAZIL**--Updating SCDX-1828, Radio Bras broadcasts in German 18:50-19:50 hrs on 11955 kHz (and possibly 6065 kHz). (Siegfried Heldt and H.V. Leidinger, both West Germany; and Friedrich Müggenburg and E. Barthel, both GDR) 11955 kHz is also being used for Portuguese to Europe, the Middle East, and Africa at 21:00 hrs. (Benedito Sérgio C. de Souza)

**ECUADOR**--HCJB now broadcasts to Europe mornings on 6205, 9870, and 11835 kHz. Swedish is carried on these fqs 05:30-06:00 hrs daily and weekends 06:30-07:00 hrs. German is 06:00-06:30 and English 07:00-08:30 hrs. (Siegfried Heldt, West Germany; Werner Rauth, Austria, Kay Kottonau, Friedrich Müggenburg, and L. Freye, all GDR, "Media Monitor", and HCJB) "DX Party Line" has changed the time for its Saturday edition to Europe. It's now heard at 07:00 hrs. That schedule is unsuitable for Europeans, but the British-based International Shortwave League has had a number of weekly nets for some time, for example Sundays at 14:00 hrs on 14285 kHz. **SWEDEN**--The new MW transmitter in Sölvesborg has begun regular operation on 1179 kHz. We're interested in reception reports, and we're raffling off record albums to 20 of those who have sent reports by April 1st. On Mar. 31st changes will be made in our programming: At 16:00 we'll no longer be broadcasting in English on 1179 and 6065 kHz. The Swedish relay at 17:00 hrs moves into that slot. English continues then to South Asia on 11940 kHz. The Swedish relay to Europe and Africa at 11:30 hrs changes to 10:30, on 9715 kHz. The parallel broadcast to the Middle East will be dropped. At 11:30 hrs the French broadcast to Europe and Africa on 21690 kHz will be joined by 9630 kHz. At 17:00 hrs the Russian broadcast to Europe on 11955 kHz will be joined by 6065 and 1179 kHz. The SSB relays of the domestic service in Swedish shifts one hour earlier GMT. (Anita Engström, RSI)

**WRTH**--The 1985 edition of the "World Radio TV Handbook" has finally arrived. The WRTH is the SWL's standard reference. It lists virtually every long, medium, shortwave, and TV broadcaster in the world. As usual, Larry Magne offers excellent reviews of the latest shortwave receivers, but this year's review only covers three standard desktop receivers, as well as one fixed frequency model, two active preselectors and two active antennas. Anker Petersen has written an interesting introduction to tropical band DXing, and there are also articles about Swiss Radio International's 50th anniversary and about Radio Netherlands' new Flevo transmitter station. The WRTH is the standard by which news for this program is evaluated--if it's in the WRTH, it isn't news for Sweden Calling DXers. Unfortunately, for political or economic reasons, many listeners in Eastern Europe or the Third World are unable to purchase the WRTH. We encourage those of you buying the new edition to send your old book to a DX club in the Third World. There's a list of clubs beginning on page 557 of the new WRTH.

**COMPUTER CORNER**-- We've mentioned before the ANARC computer information committee, which distributes home computer software for shortwave listeners. Some of you may have ordered the Commodore 64 program written by our DX Editor, "SW Guide", with shortwave broadcasts to Europe. Alan Roe has noted a problem, that if there are too many stations listed at one time, some of them scroll off the screen. He's written a subroutine to cure this problem. If you have a copy of that program and would like to improve it, write to us and we'll send you a copy of the subroutine listing. We're in the process of preparing an update to the program with more up-to-date frequencies, which will be sent to the ANARC committee soon.

The Europe program is actually based on a series of programs developed by Bill Cole. The problem with these programs has been that to update them, one has to modify long lists of data lines. Now Bill has developed a database version, which allows the user to directly edit the station information from within the program. The program is excellent, but it requires a Commodore 64 computer and disk drive. It comes complete with a disk with the latest schedule of shortwave stations to North America. One warning -if you want to create your own disk file, for example with stations broadcasting to Europe, it takes the very slow Commodore drive 2 hours to construct a new file disk. The program is available in the US for \$10, \$11 for airmail elsewhere, from Bill Cole, 107 Charles St., North Cape May, N.J. 08204, USA.



**SURINAM**--Radio Apintie has returned to the air. It's been heard on 5006 kHz at 03:40-03:59 hrs. (Finn Krone on AWR, via "Media Monitor")

**INTERNATIONAL RED CROSS**--The Red Cross Broadcasting Service continues to broadcast on the last Sunday of each month, via transmitters in Switzerland. There are omnidirectional broadcasts on 7210 kHz in English at 11:00 hrs, in German at 12:00 hrs, and Spanish at 12:20 hrs, with a repeat in English the following day at 17:00 hrs. There are broadcasts in English 09:40-09:55 hrs to West Africa on 17795 kHz, to East Africa on 21630 kHz, to Asia and Australia on 21520 kHz, and to Asia on 17830 kHz. There is also a broadcast to Asia 15:45-16:00 hrs on 11870 kHz. There are broadcasts in Portuguese 10:10-10:25 hrs to West Africa on 11795 kHz and to East Africa on 21630 kHz. There are broadcasts in Spanish on the following day (still Sunday in the target area) to Central America at 00:00 and 02:00 hrs on 9635 kHz. (Pascal Britz, France)

**UNOFFICIAL RADIO**--The anti-Cuban government La Voz del CID relayed Radio Free Surinam at 20:28 hrs on Feb. 24th on 9940 and 11680 kHz. Programs from Radio Free Surinam were last heard on 6850 kHz many months ago. (BBC MS) The Sudan Peoples Liberation Army station Radio SPLA has been heard 14:30-17:00 hrs on 17940 kHz in Arabic, with announcements in English on the hour. This transmitter is probably in Libya. There's another broadcast, probably from Ethiopia, 13:00-14:00 hrs on 9610 kHz. (Lars Aström) A Voz de Verdade, which seems to support the anti-Angolan government UNITA movement has been heard at 03:13 hrs on 4950 kHz. This station is believed to transmit from the same site as the anti-Zimbabwe Radio Truth as well as an anonymous station which broadcasts in Spanish to Cuban troops in Angola. Direction-finding locates this transmitter in the northern Transvaal in South Africa. ("Media Monitor") The Irish private station Radio Valleri International has resumed broadcasts on 6870 kHz Sundays 10:00-13:00 hrs. This station broadcast previously from October 1973 until late 1979. (Derek Jones, Radio Valleri International)

**PUBLICATIONS**--The next edition of the "Union of Asian DXers" newsletter will be a special edition printed in Germany, with nearly 20 pages of information about radio in Asia. It should also carry the first publication of Victor Goonetilleke's speech from last year's EDXC conference here in Stockholm. The special issue will be available for 2 IRCs in Europe and 3 IRCs elsewhere, from: Gerhard Werdin, Kolpinkstrasse 4, D-4030 Ratingen, West Germany. Universal Shortwave Radio has published the first edition of the "DXers Directory". This lists hundreds of shortwave listeners, mostly in the United States, but in a number of other countries as well, by both name and location. There are also lists of listener clubs both in North America and outside, as well as a section of listener photos. More listeners are encouraged to send listings to the directory. The goal is 2000 names for the 1986 edition. The directory is available for \$6, from Universal Shortwave Radio, 1280 Aida Drive, Reynoldsburg, Ohio 43068, USA.

NEW ILR STATIONS are planned for Aylesbury, Basingstoke and Andover, the Borders (Hawick) with Berwick, Cambridge and Newmarket, Derby, Dorchester/Weymouth, Eastbourne/Hastings, Hertford and Harlow, Milton Keynes, North West Wales (Conway Bay), Oxford/Banbury, Redruth/Falmouth/Penzance/Truro, Shrewsbury and Telford, Southampton, Stranraer/Dumfries/Galloway, Yeovil/Taunton, Whitehaven and Workington/Carlisle.

## Reception Reports

Almost all UK radio stations will readily verify reception reports with a confirmation card or letter, providing they are correct and well presented. A friendly letter to the station has a much better chance of receiving a favourable response than formal report forms. Return postage (either mint UK stamps or an International Reply Coupon) should always be enclosed. It is also worth remembering that station engineers are particularly busy when a station first comes on the air and from experience we have found that replies to reports sent within the first few months of a station opening can take several months. However, we do not know of any cases where a station has not eventually cleared the backlog of reports.

Reports to the BBC National Networks (Radios One, Two, Three and Four) should be sent to address No.1. This address can also be used for any BBC test transmissions; these often take place well before local studios have been constructed.

Reports to the BBC National Regions (Ulster, Scotland, Wales) and also to BBC Local stations should be addressed to the ENGINEER IN CHARGE at the station. Where an address is not known, your letter can be addressed c/o BBC, Broadcasting House, London, W1A 1AA and will be forwarded to the station concerned through the BBC's very efficient internal postal service - this covers all the Corporations offices in the United Kingdom.

Reports to Independent Local Radio stations should be sent to the CHIEF ENGINEER at the address listed. Alternatively, the Independent Broadcasting Authority will issue QSL's for any ILR station from their Engineering Information Service, Crawley Court, Winchester, Hampshire, SO21 2QA. This address is particularly useful for engineering test transmissions which usually take place before official test transmissions commence. Remember too that it is the IBA and not the local radio contractor that owns and operates the transmitters.
